

Declaration of Intent No gift Policy 2024 Fiscal Year

I, Narong Aphikulvanich, M.D., Secretary-General of the Food and Drug Administration (Thai FDA), in my capacity as the Chief Executive Officer of Thai FDA, hereby declare a "No Gift Policy" and demonstrate intention on behalf of the executives, officers and all personnel in Thai FDA to drive Thai FDA to become the organization whose executives, officers and all personnel will not accept any gifts or presents before, during and after performing duties, whether such bribes will encourage corruption and misconduct either at present or in the future times.

We will join forces to create our organizational culture of honesty along with fostering and raising awareness of positive attitude and building mindset and value in performing duties so as we can voluntary separate private interest from public interests as well as putting the public interest over personal interest.

We will raise our public consciousness and perform our duties with integrity, transparency, fairness and no discrimination. Our privilege or work position shall not be employed upon people's suffering to gain benefits or advantages.

We refrain from any actions that may create conflict between private and public interests. Any assets or benefits which may be converted to money shall not be accepted more than those that can be justly obtained under laws, rules or regulations issued by provisions of law or those that may be accepted for ethical reasons or as permitted by the Ministry of Public Health Code of Conduct in accordance with criteria and amount laid down by the National Anti-Corruption Commission.

We strictly adhere to the Code of Ethics for Government Official and Guidelines regarding receiving or offering gift or other benefit from/to Thai FDA officers of all positions and levels in order to achieve our goal of "FDA Together Against Corruption: TAC".
